Maria Galmarini-Kabala, Ph.D

USA

Dr. Maria Galmarini-Kabala is an Assistant Professor of history and the coordinator of the Russian Studies minor at JMU. Her research focuses on the Soviet Union and explores a wide range of themes, including the history of social rights and welfare, political imprisonment, and biomedical approaches to people with disabilities. At the symposium Dr. Galmarini-Kabala will present the report «The «Psychically Sick» Child: Wars, Medical Diagnoses, and Everyday Life in a 1920s Psychiatric Institution». Maria's theories are based on modern scientific publications and literature. The empiric basement of the report is presented by materials from the Mental-health school-resort in Perm, collected from 1926 to 1929.



Malcolm John Reed, Ph.D United Kingdom

Dr. Malcolm John Reed is a President of the Executive committee of ISCAR (International Society for Cultural-historical Activity Research). Senior Lecturer in Education in Graduate School of Education University of Bristol.

Dr. Reed's research interests have grown out of the radical situation in which he taught, he has a long-standing interest in children's writing in secondary schools and support for pedagogic development in schools facing challenging circumstances. Previous research into literacy and interaction is published in "Managing the Literacy Curriculum" (Webster, Beveridge & Reed, 1996). At both theoretical and practical levels, he seeks to apply and extend perspectives in cultural-historical and activity theory in relation to school classrooms. He also explores secondary cultures through non-traditional, ethnographic methods and has published to date six papers using narrative methodologies in educational journals.

Dr. Reed is coordinator of the Doctor of Education Narrative Research pathway on which he teaches seven units with Dr. Jane Speedy and also designs and teaches the Learning unit in the EdD Management pathway. Dr. Reed currently supervises twenty EdD dissertation students and three PhD students. The presentation title: «The concept of agency in classroom interaction»

From 1999 to 2011 Prof. Veresov had been affiliated to Kajaani Teacher Training Department (Finland) as a Senior Researcher and the Scientific Director of the international projects. Holding a position of A/Professor at Monash, Prof. Nikolay Veresov is a co-leader of Monash International research group on child development and invited researcher/professor at the University of Lower Silesia (Poland) in 2011, Imam University (Saudi Arabia) in 2011, University of Brasilia (Brazil) in 2014. Prof. Veresov is a member of Editorial Boards of several journals, such as Outlines: critical practice studies, Cultural-historical psychology and International Research in Early Childhood Education.

Prof. Nikolay Veresov published 5 books and over 70 articles available in 10 languages.
